At least five councils outsourced internal reviews of parking fines to a private contractor over a 10-year period. Two councils publicly acknowledged legal doubts about this arrangement and allocated millions of dollars to refund affected motorists. Three others asserted their practices were lawful, with a generic signature on review letters disguising the identity of their decision makers. While it was reasonable for these councils to seek legal advice, they failed to ensure transparency and accountability in their decision making.
