Operation Daintree was an investigation by the Independent Broad-based Anti-corruption Commission (IBAC) highlighting how improper influence compromised the procurement process for a \$1.2m contract awarded to a union-established training group, and compromised the management of the contract.

Operation Watts was the first ever joint investigation conducted by IBAC and the Victorian Ombudsman. The investigation examined a range of matters including allegations of misuse of electorate offices, ministerial office staff and resources for branch stacking and other party-related activities.

IBAC held public hearings during 2019 and 2020 into allegations of serious corrupt conduct in relation to planning and property development decisions at the City of Casey council. Report yet to be tabled.

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Victorian Ombudsman

Councils and complaints: Glen Eira City Council's approach to contractor work

The Council's handling of the complaint was contrary to the spirit of its own policy, not to mention the Local Government Act, both of which adopt a broad definition of complaint.

The Victorian Ombudsman investigation found widespread inconsistency in the way councils across the state handle complaints about the services they outsource to third-party contractors.
