- Cardboard/Paper

Return to Manufacturer (close the loop)

- Printer Cartridges



Cardboard/Paper

- 1. First in process (backbone of industry)
- 2. Ease of Recycling
- 3. Cost savings over raw material (wood pulp)
- 4. Finite Recycing life
- 5. Once huge export markets, now reduced
- 6. Domestic capacity
- 7. Commodity value \$50-250/t



Plastics

- 1. By-product of petroleum manufacturing
- 2. 7 common types, 3 common in packaging
- 3. Difficult to recycle/low rates of recycling
- 4. Few downstream recyclers in Australia
- 5. Recovered last in the process
- 5. Enviornmental catastrophy!
- 7. Commodity value almost worthless



Glass

- 1. Infinitely recyclable
- 2. Mature Local industry
- 3. Cost savings over raw material (silica/soda ash)
- 4. No export market
- 5. 56% of consumer glass recycled
- 6. Easily contaminated
- 7. Commodity value \$0-70/t



Steel and Aluminium

- 1. Infinitely recyclable
- 2. Mature Local industry
- 3. Cost savings over raw material (silica/soda ash)
- 4. High demand for exports (aluminium)
- 5. 88% of consumer packaging recycled
- 6. High commodity value: \$1,000t for aluminium



FOGO

- 1. Successful pilot completed
- 2. Removing food and organics from Landfill (50% of waste bin)
- 3. Processed into compost and used in commercial landscaping and agriculture
- 4. Cost savings and better environmental outcomes



The Eden Project

- 1. Reclaiming coal mine for environmental tourism
- 2. Highly successful eco-tourism attraction based in Cornwall, England
- 3. Currently out for community consultation



Our industry challenges

- 1. National problem needs national solutions
- 2. Parliamentary inquiry into Recycling and Waste Management
- 3. Lack of competition in recycling industry/rising costs
- 4. Lack of product stewardship and downstream industries
- 5. Increasingly complex & costly management of Landfills
- 6. No political mandate
